## ❄️ SNOW ALERT ❄️

Our Public Works Department is working hard to make driving safer and easier in snowy weather conditions. Borough trucks may plow your street several times during these inclement times. As snow rolls off our plows, it will accumulate in driveway aprons and on sidewalks. Please understand that this is unavoidable and we apologize for any inconvenience you may experience while clearing your driveway after the plows have passed.

To ensure safety of pedestrians, residents must remove snow from sidewalks following a snowfall. During recent storms the Public Works Department observed and notified residents using snowblowers to blow all snow on lawn areas. Also, we ask that residents do not shovel the snow back on to the street. Please throw snow back onto lawn areas towards your homes. Once an area is plowed curb to curb, that area is considered finished and will not be plowed again if snow is being thrown back into the street.

Here are some helpful hints to make "snow" business less frustrating:

- Shovel the snow to the right of your driveway (facing the street, left when facing your home) to minimize the amount of snow entering your driveway.
- If possible, wait until borough trucks have made at least three passes on your street before clearing your driveway.
- If possible, do not park cars on the street from one hour after snow has continuously fallen until 12 hours after snow has stopped. This speeds the removal process and prevents cars from being snowed in.

Please remove portable basketball courts from the street or parking strip. The borough is not responsible for any damages incurred due to plowing. Facts: It takes sunlight and traffic in addition to salt and sand to completely remove ice and compacted snow from roadways. The average car length is 14 feet. If parked on the street during a snowstorm, the area that would have to be shoveled to park in front of a clean curb is 42 feet. The average driveway apron is 12 feet. A total of 30 feet of non-shoveling area would be gained if residents who have driveways use them. We thank you for your cooperation.

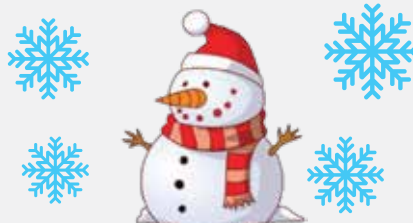

### NOTICE DURING SNOW STORMS

In the event of a snow storm, the Bellmawr Highway Department is asking all residents who have portable basketball courts to remove them from the curb and street during snow storms, because of liabilities. This enables the plows to come down the street with no obstacles to hinder our plowing procedures. We ask that residents shovel snow within 12 hours after the storm has ended.



## CHARLES J. SAUTER, JR. PLAYGROUND IMPROVEMENTS

Thanks to a grant awarded by the New Jersey Division of Community Affairs (NJDC), the Borough began installing new swings and inclusive playground equipment at the highly visited Charles J. Sauter Jr. Playground on September 8<sup>th</sup>.

The Department of Public Works will perform general site preparations, site clearing, grading, the initial installation of a DGA subgrade, and various playground equipment installations prior to a subcontractor installing a poured-in-place rubber safety surface in specific areas of the playground.

The project could take up to six weeks to complete depending on weather conditions. The existing playground will be fenced off while the park is under construction and monitored by closed-circuit cameras. Residents are still welcome to utilize the walking track and are encouraged to visit Bellmawr's main playground located at the Bellmawr Recreation Center while construction is underway.

Special thanks to Bellmawr's Superhero, A.J. Gonzales, for collaborating with us in selecting the new playground equipment. We hope to have a ribbon-cutting ceremony in mid-October to break in our newly renovated playground. Everyone is invited to attend!

## BELLMAWR FIRE DEPARTMENT – DIVISION OF FIRE

As the cooler months approach, the Bellmawr Fire Department: Division of Fire would like to share some important seasonal safety tips and community updates:

### Fire Safety Reminders:

**Heating Safety:** Keep space heaters at least three feet away from anything that can burn. Never leave them unattended.

**Fireplaces & Chimneys:** Have your chimney cleaned and inspected before use. Always use a protective screen.

**Holiday Safety:** Be mindful of candles, decorative lights, and Christmas trees. Use UL-approved lights and turn them off when leaving home.

**Smoke & CO Alarms:** Test your smoke and carbon monoxide alarms monthly. Replace batteries as needed.

**Leaf Piles:** Do not park vehicles on top of leaf piles. Hot exhaust systems and catalytic converters under vehicles can easily ignite dry leaves, quickly causing a vehicle fire and potentially spreading to nearby homes, property, or other vehicles.

**Community Engagement:** Our firefighters will be participating in Fire Prevention Week activities at local schools, helping to teach children the importance of fire safety.

The department will also continue its tradition of supporting community holiday events.

## BELLMAWR FIRE DEPARTMENT: FIRE MARSHAL'S OFFICE CHARGE INTO FIRE SAFETY!

This year's Fire Prevention Week™ (FPW™) campaign, October 5-11, "Charge into Fire Safety™: Lithium-Ion Batteries in Your Home," works to educate everyone about using these batteries safely. The campaign stresses how important it is to Buy, Charge, and Recycle when it comes to lithium-ion batteries.

### Charge into Fire Safety: 3 Steps

- 1. Buy only listed products.** When buying a product that uses a lithium-ion battery, look for a safety certification mark such as UL, ETL, or CSA. This means it meets important safety standards.
- 2. Charge devices safely.** Always use the cords that came with the product to charge. Follow the instructions from the manufacturer. Buy new chargers from the manufacturer or one that the manufacturer has approved. Charge your device on a hard surface. Don't overcharge your device. Unplug it or remove the battery when it's fully charged.
- 3. Recycle batteries responsibly.** Don't throw lithium-ion batteries in the trash or regular recycling bins because they could start a fire. Recycle your device or battery at a safe battery recycling location. Visit [call2recycle.org](http://call2recycle.org) to find a recycling spot near you.



## BELLMAWR OFFICE OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

As we transition into the Fall and Winter months, the Bellmawr Office of Emergency Management reminds all residents to stay prepared and vigilant for potential weather hazards.

### Hurricane Season Preparedness

Hurricane season runs through November 30<sup>th</sup>. While our region may not always experience direct hits, the impacts of strong storms—such as heavy rain, high winds, and localized flooding—can affect our community.

#### How to Stay Prepared:

- Assemble or update your emergency supply kit (water, food, medications, flashlights, batteries, etc.).
- Keep storm drains cleared.
- Secure outdoor furniture and loose items that may become projectiles in high winds.
- Stay informed by signing up for local alerts and monitoring trusted weather sources.

### Winter Storm Preparedness

Winter storms can bring snow, ice, high winds, and dangerous road conditions.

#### Now is the time to prepare:

- Ensure your home is winter-ready: check heating systems, insulate pipes, and have extra fuel or backup heat sources.
- Keep a supply of essentials on hand, including non-perishable food, bottled water, and necessary medications.
- Assemble a vehicle emergency kit with blankets, a shovel, ice scraper, and extra warm clothing.
- Avoid parking vehicles on snow emergency routes to allow plows and emergency vehicles to safely pass.
- Preparedness is a community effort. Thank you for doing your part to keep Bellmawr safe and resilient!

## BELLMAWR ZONING OFFICE – FALL/WINTER 2025 UPDATE

The Bellmawr Zoning Office would like to remind residents and business owners of a few important items:

### Permits & Projects

- All new construction, additions, fences, sheds, driveways, patios, and certain home improvements require zoning approval before work begins. If you are in doubt, please contact our office to verify if a permit is needed.
- Seasonal projects such as installing decks, patios, or sheds should be submitted early to avoid delays during colder months.
