

BELLMAWR PD DEPLOYS USE OF BODY-WORN CAMERAS

The deployment of body-worn cameras (BWC) began on January 14, 2022.

It is the policy of the Bellmawr Police Department to utilize body-worn cameras to assist agency personnel in the performance of their duties by providing an unbiased and accurate recorded account of an incident.

Body-worn cameras are utilized by patrol officers and detectives and are worn on the officer's chest. A solid red light indicates the BWC is recording

This means that Bellmawr residents can prevent solicitors from showing up at their doors by registering their name and address with the Bellmawr Police Records Clerk. The form is available for download on Bellmawr.com under Public Documents and Forms and navigating to the Police category, or you can request a form by visiting the Records Clerk during regular business hours.


ALWAYS READY TO LEND A HELPING HAND


